The hub of upper Swaledale, Reeth is a thriving community and supports a wide range of businesses and shops. It lies at the meeting point of Arkengarthdale and Swaledale and is surrounded by the heather moorland-topped fells of Fremington Edge and Calver Hill.

Mentioned in the Domesday book, the name comes from the old English, meaning 'the place by the stream' and is a popular stop-off on Wainwright's Coast to Coast walk. A triangular green is at the centre of a sprawling cluster of 18th century houses and buildings, with traditional cobbles fronting the shops on High Row.



Known as the 'capital of Swaledale', Reeth was the centre of the lead mining industry, at its height in the mid 19th century, but uncertainties often meant miners needed poor relief, so Reeth workhouse was built in Back Lane in 1753. Despite its remoteness, the village was supplied with electricity before Middlesbrough and nowadays Reeth is at the heart of the local farming community.

Reeth village has a thriving art community and there are many shops,

galleries and cafés offering unique local crafts, furniture, foods and clothing. Many events take place on the green during the year, including quoits and firework displays. The highlights of the year are the Swaledale Festival, which includes walks, concerts and talks, and Reeth Show.
